• <u>PRAASA Report</u> Beth S – the first PRAASA was in 1968 in Fresno; it was in Sparks this years; next year in Irvine; purpose of PRAASA to promote unity; the three legacies; 1970 flyer third year finally started being called PRAASA; drove through a snow storm; pretty much showed willing to go to any lengths; we got settled in; it was super fun at a Casino; topics that were discussed were really interesting – inclusion, personal sacrifice, translations; the timing system green light, yellow, red, clapping; anonymity and humility; at the end of the evening we went to the round tables discussions were we met in smaller groups; still a new GSR so I went to the GSR round table; it felt good because I was able to follow and I knew what they were talking about; a lot of others didn't; we're doing a great job here; BTG round table; YP round table; business meeting; sound equipment; What's on your mind; delegate ask it basket; I was inspired because there were a lot of YP THERE; and ACYPAA was happening at same time; I was really moved by what everyone was sharing; really glad I got to go; I hope everyone can go at some point and if you do - find a way to stretch... there's so much sitting.

Topic: *Why a GSR should attend the Post-Conference Assembly*? The simplest answer is right in our Service Manual - in job description; experience the truly democratic process of out service structure; communication; follow path to conference; full reports and get the story so you can be a part of; quoting from service manual; Also, two motions at the Area business meeting in the morning; literature on meditation; new edition of big book; easy to take to your group and get feedback because these are topics that almost everyone will have an opinion on// Q: how does a motion get to the business meeting at the Area? //A: a good example of what happens is the current agenda topic RE returning the text to "living sober" motion; that came from a district in our Area; and the motions I just mentioned- if passed – will be passed on to Board as requests to be Agenda Topics; both things where the input is wanted and needed; Also at the Post-Conf we have panel discussions and someone from SF's district will be presenting; as far as the delegate's report - first time we get to hear about it; get a chance to ask questions; there's something about being with the bigger group of people hearing the delegate will be

coming here in June; I actually had a profound spiritual experience at a post conf assembly; there was an agenda topic that was similar to some discussed this year; inclusion topic; I was in early recovery; I tried to be neutral; some people were for and some were against; I had so much fear of going to the mic; at the time I had so much fear; I walked through the fear at the Pre-conf to give my group's voice; so after I had gone through that and then at the post-conf heard the delegate and he was talking about what he saw heard and felt; I started to get a little bit of a grasp of how special the process is; he did make it found fun and exciting; the topic had died on the conf floor; then a handful of delegates got together and came up with a floor action; revived it – the topic; in that moment I felt like there were people who I didn't know stood up for something I believed in and I felt like I belonged; I was crying and able to take it back to my group feeling of being part of something bigger; after we did all this work to prepare our current delegate; it is worth it to hear her; I recommend it; plus it is your job; Vallejo; may 12th;

New Business:

Now I'd like to hear from people who were at PRAASA or at the Pre-Conference Assembly for the first time:

- About the experience she was having at PRAASA; the two opening panels were highly significant; trustee tasked them with scholarly presentations; about 30 delegates; only two or three spoke in the folksy AA style; all the presentations were specific; several presentations were incredibly high caliber; amazing service advice which I have taken to heart;

- That was my first PRAASA; I just went as a member; I agree that the thing that struck me the most was the depth of service; former trustees sharing powerful experience; hearing the newst translation - not a written language Navajo; they let anybody in; it was really great;

- I was at the pre conf assembly; it was my second; it was a bit more grueling; I've been going to the dinners and amazing speakers; the speaker is a former trustee and she spoke at PRAASA the year before; and I heard her then; she said something that still sticks with me "a lot of times we must think about who's not here?" Really powerful; she talked about the safety issues that keep coming up; how to be woman in AA and what is at stake for women in AA; She said "we don't need AA police because there are real police"; Big D is my drag king name;

- general service is very humbling; it takes a really long time to catch on; and we don't get to have the immediate gratification that we do working one on one; it was my first Assembly; it was really cool to have all of us sitting there; I heard the delegate speak a while back at a YP conf; she inspired me to get a GSR commitment after hearing her; and at the pre-conf, seeing Joann up on stage being the delegate now, after I was first inspired by her specifically to get involved after I heard her at ACYPAA – that was so great; like seeing service in action hearing everyone and watching how much she cares; and I have to say

it's taken me a really long time to start to feel like I kind of get what we're doing here; it's a whole year of learning and I feel like now I can finally start getting it; feeling grateful to be a part of
