Teddy B-W. Gives Delegate Report

-Started out at home group in SF 13 years ago standing for GSR position; Service; voted in as delegate last November 2018; Listening in a new way became my job; Past delegate (Joanne) takes new delegate to airport prior to conference; Conference is 6 days (Sun-Fri...or 3am Saturday morning!); Saturday prior is unofficial conference activities-12x12x12=1728 meeting; remote communities meeting (teddy presented here and spoke of experience working with Spanish speaking women); a time to build connections w/ future friends for life; 135 members of General Service Conference: 93 delegates, 27 directors and trustees, 15 special workers; "Steps release bondage of self, traditions release the bondage of personalities, concepts release the bondage of agendas"; Sunday: Trustee from Canada (Scott) presented on AA around the world, "Unity is grounded in the acceptance of our differences. Not every country experiences AA in the same way"; Delegates from Turkey attended for the first time. "The Nameless Sobers" = AA in Iran; Treasurer presented 141 slides on finances in AA: highlights =25 million of combined income after expenses net ?98,000 in the black. Some AA members think it would be a wonderful gesture to send \$8.06 to GSO on August 06 OR "make it a double" send \$16.12 ©; Last year the amount of group contributions decreased; Good spiritual practice to encourage financial contributions from groups and individuals; Grapevine/La Vina- Teddy always reads the daily quote and is a spiritual giant; New GV book out "Take me to Your Sponsor"; Character of the Conference was "Love and Laughter"; Agenda Topics are the actual Agendas for each conference committee. These are what GSRs obtain group consciences on to give to the delegate. Advisory actions may be produced out of

some of these agendas. They may also become committee consideration (no opinions, only questions asked) for these; Teddy served on Treatment and Accessibilities committee (includes Remote Communities) Most decisions made were voted on unanimously; Some committee reports took <10 min, some took several hours. Most of the time this year was spent on Public Information Committee report (5 hours) should full faces be featured in PSAs? Reviewed PSAs from Australia. Restated policy on full faces in PSAs; Policy says these full face ads may not include faces of actual or potential AA members. Recommendation made for an actor portrayal disclaimer on these announcements. Pamphlet on Understanding anonymity- should there be clarification that the traditions are not a cloak to protect inappropriate or illegal behavior? Teddy voted that the language should be included. Passed 108 to 20 votes; Teddy sat with a different group at each lunch time. All attendees are there to do the best for AA with an open mind and allowing for full discussion. Presentations interspersed the reports. Public Information report discussed social media and approved all eight items brought by the committee Friday morning T&A first up; rec'd story from a deaf member added to pamphlet "Access to AA" approved; updated pamphlet AA for the Older Alcoholic; will produce pamphlet for military professionals including information/language on anonymity protection. Lit committee- initially in favor of 5th edition of Big Book; Many felt that focus on a 5th edition would take away from moving in the direction of bringing AA into the 21st century. Importance of the 5th edition being an enduring "final" text; Farewell Brunch: goodbyes to those at the end of term for trustees. Sharing of a candle lighting ceremony. Oldtimers and Newcomers alike light the candles of all AA members. Questions: John B requests description of Teddy's daily ritual at conference. Teddy made a little altar for spiritual practice with items from AA members, went to morning AA meeting prior to conference. Steve requested direct quote to be included in Understanding Anonymity pamphlet. // Gabriella requests more information on majority vote against 5th addition of the big book. Teddy expressed concern over "digital first" rationale during minority opinion at the mic. Feels that a 5th edition is simply a "not yet." // Peter F. questions about the trustees and what role they serve // Theresa – if another edition of the BB is published, it might be the last, why is that? A: Intervals 25 years; if AA was founded today would our first thought be to create a book; in 25 years time will the people entering AA look at a book as an historical artifact; we'll be creating so much other content; We also have a couple of handouts – top ten things that happened; also a sheet of interesting facts and stats; // Justin- we'll be having the conference report coming out soon.
